On Saturday, July 14th, the Inner City Youth Racing League Mayor's Cup, Stock Division, was won by our own neighborhood youth outreach, "KIDS, Inc." located at former School #18 on Palmer Street. The Inner City Youth Racing League is a new idea using an old event, Soap Box Derby. This new league is directed specifically towards inner city youth. The Inaugural Mayor's Cup Race had 28 participants from various agencies and community organizations in Indianapolis. "KIDS, Inc." also took 4th place and best exterior car design in the Stock Division and 8th place in the Super Stock Division.

There were a total of 14 youth involved as crew members, handlers, and drivers in the "KID'S, Inc." effort. Their sponsors were: Kelley Racing, V.M.S., Bobcat of Indy, and Beck Muffler. Next year they hope to field 2 additional cars. All of the kids involved with "KIDS, Inc." are kids from our neighborhood. They did a wonderful job and all of them were a pleasure to work with.

We have at last received the working drawings for the new shelters for the park. Our next meeting with the city will be to review the plans and get approval for them. Depending on the funding requirements and volunteer situation, we may still yet begin construction this year.

Christmas in April Grant Application

SEND, SUMO and Bates-Hendricks were not selected by the Christmas in April Home Repair community for funding of 20 homes in our neighborhood. The grant went to the Mapleton Fall Creek area. If this program is available next year we hopefully will make another run at getting funding to help with home repairs in our area.

INFRASTRUCTURE

During August, BHNA met with both of our city councilmen regarding improving the infrastructure in our neighborhood and to update them on the economic development plans for our area. We toured the area and reviewed our street and sidewalk maps. Both Frank Short and Phil Borst were helpful and made some excellent suggestions.

We will be sending in our top 10 list to them and then follow up. We have begun the prioritizing process for FY2002. Even though contracts have been let for this year, we are hopeful to get more work on our sidewalks yet this year, weather and funding permitting.

Our next focus will be the Quad II area around Hendricks Park where we are also hoping to have some new homes built and the S. East Street corridor (Quad's I, II, III, and IV) where we are hoping to have new housing and new business development. By the time you read this we should have new sidewalks curbs and final street toping on Terrace between Madison and S. East Street.
