Presentation on Development at 1202 Shelby Street



A proposal by Deylen Realty to develop the parking lot at 1202 Shelby Street (in front of police station and Family Dollar) into apartments and retail has been submitted to the Department of Metropolitan Development.

The proposal tentatively envisions the construction of a 5-story mixed-use building with 56 apartments, a 62-space parking garage, and 5,920 square feet of first floor retail. There is a pledge to maintain 45 to 55 free public spaces on a surface lot for 5 years. The development would offer 16 studios, 28 onebedrooms, and 12 two-bedroom apartments for lease. Potentially, construction could begin in 2015.

Green technology is featured in the project design, incorporating a green roof and green temperature control. Deylen Realty has already invested heavily in the Fountain Square and Fletcher Place neighborhoods with the Murphy Arts Building, Fletcher Place Lofts, and the Hinge. The project will require approval by the Indianapolis Historic Preservation Commission.

You have an opportunity to hear more about this proposal firsthand from the developer, and then weigh in on whether or not this is the type of development that you feel is best for the area.

- Monday, April 21 at 6:30pm at 924 Shelby Street, in conjunction with the Fountain Square Neighborhood Association's monthly meeting. FSNA welcomes you to join them that evening.

Letter from the President

As I look over my first year as President, I couldn't be happier. There have been so many great accomplishments and so many wonderful people moving into the neighborhood.

The accomplishment that I am most proud of is the reduction in abandoned homes. Most of the homes from the 2012 surplus sales have been fixed up and new neighbors are moving into them. Continuing with the surplus sale success, over 50 additional homes and around 10 lots have been sold in the last year. Many of these homes have already seen appreciable improvement, with a few already being lived in! 6 of the lots are seeing great improvement as they are being used for Bates-Hendricks parks. To continue the charge against abandoned housing, Renew Indianapolis has began to offer DMD properties, with two properties already being approved since the beginning of the year and many others garnering attention.

There have been amazing strides in our beautification efforts. We started with last year's Great Indy Cleanup in April with fantastic representation from the neighborhood. From there, things really began to take off! We collaborated with the TKE fraternity to landscape the Euro Plastering corridor. Next, came a work day with Lilly volunteers clearing great swaths of invasive species along Morris & Prospect Streets. Things really began to ramp up in October. Keep Indianapolis Beautiful brought forth a huge undertaking with the transformation of Baumann Park. Over multiple volunteer days, the park truly became a destination in the neighborhood. Finally, in November, Northview Church brought a volunteer army down over two days. They spent time clearing out an overgrown pathway, installing fixtures in Baumann Park, creating new landscaping beds, and even painting the entire exterior of the East Street Church of Christ!

Another thing that we can be proud of is all of the community events that we have held over the last year. Besides the well-attended September cook-out and December holiday dinner, we held a Chili Cook-off with a new partner in the neighborhood, the VFW. In addition, the New Jersey Street Block Club always puts out a fantastic Cinco de Mayo celebration, with another coming up soon!

I invite everyone to join us in celebrating at the April meeting this coming Monday at 6:30pm. We will celebrate all of the great accomplishments of the last year. Afterward, we will have a chance to discuss the things that we would like to see in the coming year, as well as have an opportunity to voice the concerns that you have in the neighborhood.
