
# **September BHNA Meeting**

Tammara Tracy will be at the August Bates-Hendricks Neighborhood Association meeting to give an update on the draft code and overall status of the Indy Rezone project.






The places of our community, how they are built and physically arranged, affect us in a myriad of ways. The effects impact us collectively and individually; some we consciously recognize, while others are subliminal.

Since Renew Indianapolis has started at the beginning of the year, there have been over 10 properties approved for sale. Even more exciting, I have recently been approached by outside investors inquiring about new home building in the neighborhood. We are truly on the cusp of a major face-lift to the neighborhood!

Before this month's Neighborhood Association meeting, we will plan to assess our homes in our annual abandoned housing survey. I am cautiously optimistic to see that, besides many of the orphaned homes

# **City Unveils Plans for New Recycling Center**

Mayor Greg Ballard and Covanta recently announced a plan for a \$45 million recycling center that will process waste from Indianapolis residents' trash to pull out recyclable material for reuse. The facility, touted as one of the most modern recycling facilities in the world, is designed to recover recyclables from regular trash pickup at no extra cost to the city or its residents. It is expected to recover up to 80-90 percent of recyclable materials, increasing recycling in the city by approximately 500 percent.

The recycling plan is subject to approval from the city's Board of Public Works. Covanta expects the facility to be up and running in 2016, following the receipt of necessary permits.
