Over the years, we have seen a steady improvement of the housing in our neighborhood. More and more rehabilitation and renovation projects are popping up. Houses that have stood abandoned for multiple years have been gutted, sometimes down to the foundation, and rebuilt. One example is a home located at the corner of Ringgold and Pleasant Run Parkway. The house was burnt to a total loss, was taken down to the foundation, and a brand new house is being built in its place!

To keep the forward momentum in the neighborhood going, we will begin our annual abandoned housing survey this month. An important part of this assessment will be to identify the most problematic of the vacant and
