Bates-Hendricks Futbol Club Returns for Another Season




The Bates-Hendricks Futbol Club is one of a number of teams competing against other Indianapolis neighborhoods in friendly soccer matches through the Indy City Futbol league. The league's number one rule is "don't be a jerk".

Our Bates-Hendricks team filled up very fast for both the spring and summer 2016 sessions, but all are welcome to come support the team at their matches on Wednesday evenings and to hang out for socializing afterwards (schedule: www.indycityfutbol.com/pages/schedule-1). Their main goal is to have fun and get some exercise, but a few wins certainly wouldn't hurt either.

Street and Alley Lighting

Is the street or alley near your house very dark? Want to brighten it up a bit to help deter crime? If so, consider adopting a pole near you through Indianapolis Power and Light. Whether the pole already has a light or not, the cost is \$18.61/month plus tax. That's pretty steep, but if you split the cost with your neighbors, that makes it more economical. However, IPL won't split your bill with neighbors; you'd have to do that on your own.

To set it up, contact Public Lighting at Indianapolis Power & Light at 317-261-8653 and give them your address and permission to charge your IPL bill. The IPL crew usually comes out within 24-48 hours to activate the light after that.



If you don't mind spending a bit more up front to get lower monthly costs, a motion-activated flood light mounted on your garage or house can go a long way to brighten your section of alley. Additionally, daylight sensors screwed into your porch light are cheap, effective ways to ensure your front yard is illuminated through the night.

10-Digit Dialing Underway in 317 Area Code

Effective now, you should use 10 digits whenever you place a local call from the 317 area code (dialing 317 followed by the number's remaining digits). If you forget and dial just 7 digits (through September 16, 2016), your call will still be completed.



Starting on September 17, 2016, you must use 10-digit dialing for all local phone calls. After this date, if you do not use the new dialing procedures, your call will not be completed and a recording will instruct you to hang up and dial again.

Beginning October 17, 2016, numbers assigned for new telephone lines or services in the 317 region may include the new 463 area code. For more information, visit www.in.gov/oucc and click on the PDF link under Featured Topics.


