Neighbors,

After many years of challenges, I am ecstatic to announce that we have applied for permits to install a few new gateway signs in our neighborhood! The first area targeted for development are the medians at East and Morris Streets in front of the Speedway gas station. The medians will be landscaped and a large sign welcoming everyone to "Historic Bates-Hendricks Neighborhood" will be installed on the north median. In the south median, we plan to install landscaping and a tall wooden post with two banners with the Bates-Hendricks logo.

Our southern border will also have a welcoming sign that will be installed on the corner of the East Street Apostolic Church's property. We are immensely thankful for their assistance in securing this home for our sign, as putting the sign in on CSX Railroad property has proved to be problematic.

While signs may seem like a small change in our large neighborhood, these will help identify our neighborhood to visitors who may be passing through on East Street. Most importantly, the signs will be the first step in further developing the East Street corridor, an area of the neighborhood that has needed more attention for quite some time.

Both signs will look similar to the gateway sign located at the Prospect Street / Morris Street interchange. Installation and plantings are scheduled for early summer, and I hope that you will take pictures and share the beautiful signs with others!
