On Saturday, April 22, a handful of volunteers came out to weed and spread mulch at Ringgold Park, which is nearing its last phase in its transformation. The project, which is funded through a Keep Indianapolis Beautiful IPL Greenspace grant, has involved planting a ton of plants and a few trees, putting down new mulch, removing the old railroad ties, and soon birdhouses will be installed.
