## **SENSE Charter School Readies Grounds for Spring**

With the advent of spring and warmer weather, SENSE Charter School was aflutter with outside activity! On March 4, 2021 staff members started working on weeding and cleaning up trash in front of the school on Barth Street and on the school grounds as part of the KIB Adopt-A-Block program. They were able to get rid of ten large bags of weeds, invasive species, and one large bag of trash.

Another cleanup occurred on March 11, 2021 to pick up trash along Barth Street and to weed all of the garden beds around SENSE Charter School in preparation for spring plantings. Several staff volunteers from SENSE helped with that cleanup, as well as the good folks from Full Circle.
